



Part of our 2024 Ingathering was to write down the things that we were thankful for. Here is what Saint Mark's parishioners had to say....


Jesus in my life, my children, my friends, my numerous blessings, The Saint Mark's Family.



As we continue our Advent walk, we invite you to see the Way of Love as a journey that can expand to include family and friends. Mary said "yes" to the call to birth Jesus, God's Word, into the world and immediately went in haste to share her good news with her cousin, Elizabeth—a four-day journey into the Judean hills. Isn't that what happens when we hear good news? We are driven to go and tell others. The Way of Love is good news that demands to be shared.

Sunday, December 8 WORSHIP

Read Luke 3:1-6. How does the story of John the Baptist fill your heart with hope?

Monday, December 9 PRAY

Pray along with the Collect for Advent 2, found on page 211 of The Book of Common Prayer. As you are out and about for the rest of this week, notice the people you pass. Ask God to bless them in their lives and work. See how this changes the way you go about your week.

Tuesday, December 10 TURN

Do you have amends or apologies or adjustments you need to make? Ask God to open your heart and mind to those opportunities for reconciliation and growth. Thank God for the gifts of mercy and love, and the courage to make the changes necessary. And then do your best, with God's help, to make those changes.

Wednesday, December 11 BLESS

We know that angels are God's special messengers to us, and that Gabriel spent intentional time with Mary, helping her to understand her part in God's story. Who has shared an important lesson or their presence with you this week? Thank them today with a call or note.

Thursday, December 12 REST

Set aside 30 minutes to spend in silence with your best friend today. Sure, it may feel a little weird to be silent on the phone or while sitting next to each other on the couch or across the table. Just give it a try. Make sure to set aside time after your silence to pray for each other and to say thanks for the time of rest.

Friday, December 13

Go out of your way to have a conversation with someone you might not normally visit with today. Ask God to open your heart to hear this person as God does.

Saturday, December 14 LEARN

Read Luke 1:45. Share your faith story with one new person this week. It can be someone you have known for a while who has not heard the faith part of your story.



Over the years Advent has become a favorite time in the liturgical year for me. It wasn't always that way - there was a time when I raced through the season of Advent without a thought to what it meant or what a gift the "getting ready" time could be. However, years of working in Christian formation and intentional spiritual practices have provided a wonderful opportunity to experience Advent through a different lens.

The scripture we hear during Advent on Sundays, in daily reflections or during a pageant lovingly presented to the community, offers opportunities to reflect on themes of spiritual preparation, journey, expectation, and the willingness to acknowledge/engage and say "yes". Those themes invite us all to walk in love during Advent.

I'm particularly drawn to scripture that provides a glimpse into those moments when a person's faith is embodied with some expression of embracing the plans God has set in motion. I think of those expressions as yes moments. For example, when Mary hears the angel Gabriel say "Greetings, favored one" and learns of the journey that God has planned - her response, "Here I am Lord..." is a yes moment. Joseph too says "yes" when he embraces what he is called to do in a dream and takes Mary as his wife. When shepherds learn of the Messiah's birth their journey to Bethlehem to see the child is yet another affirmation moment when they choose to "go and see".

Granted, heavenly heralds had much to do with the yes moments mentioned. However, I would suggest that heavenly invitations abound in our communities today. When we commit to walking in love, we open ourselves up to those yes opportunities to lend our wealth, works, and wisdom to a world in need. Imagine what God is calling us to say "yes" to as we walk in love during Advent and in the year ahead.

Questions for Reflection:

How might you say "yes" and use your wealth, works, and wisdom in your community?

In a world that is often hurting who do you imagine is waiting for us to say "yes" and walk with them on their journey?



Can I donate stocks to Saint Mark's?

When considering a gift or pledge for Saint Mark's, if you own stocks, you might want to look at donating highly appreciated stocks directly to the church's account. If you were to sell them first, you would have to pay capital gains on the appreciation but if you send the stock directly to the church without selling it, you get credit for the appreciated value of the stock without incurring a tax expense. The church will sell it immediately upon receipt and advise you of the value of your gift.




