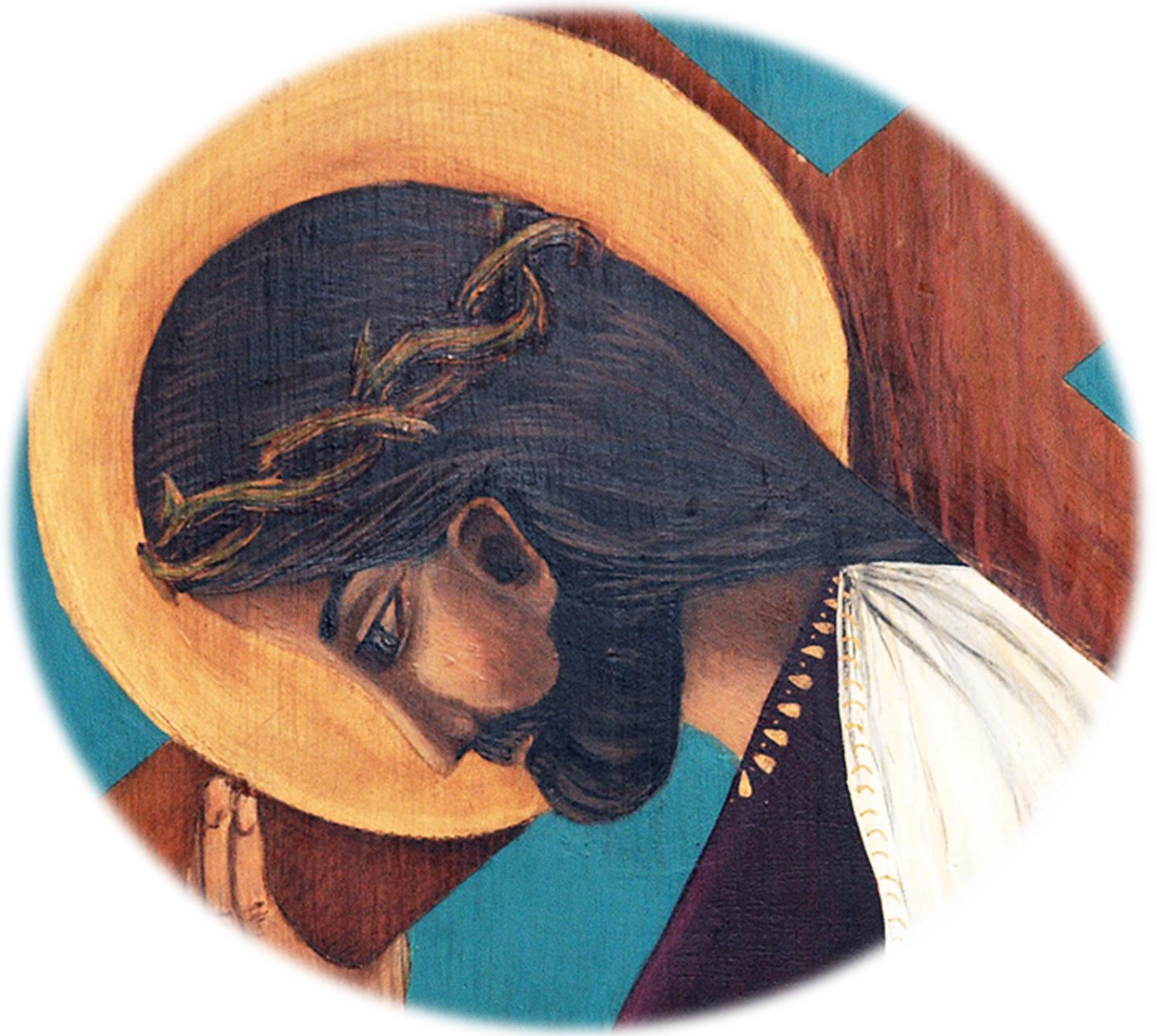


The Way of the Cross

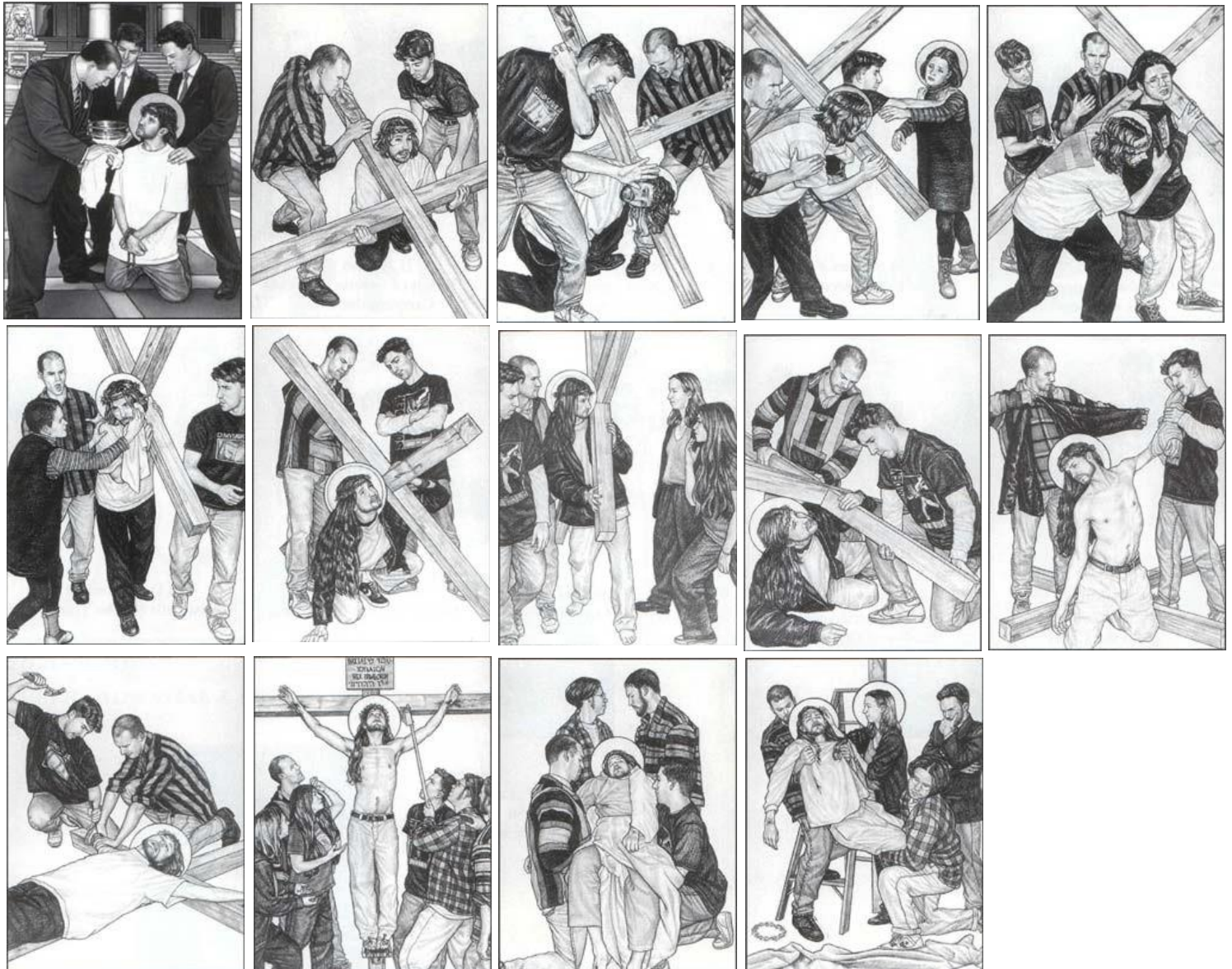


Stations of the Cross

These are depictions of 14 incidents in the Gospel accounts of Jesus' death from Pilate's house to being placed in the tomb. They are used for the service called the Way of the Cross, which visits each station in turn with a brief reading, response, collect and on some occasions, a meditation. This is particularly appropriate for Good Friday and all Fridays in Lent.

During the late Middle Ages, when the Turkish occupation of the Holy Land prevented pilgrims from visiting its sacred sites, the faithful made a custom of making simple replicas of those sacred sites in Europe, where they could come to pray. Medieval Christians sought more details about the Passion of the Lord, beyond what was provided by the succinct stories of the gospels. They turned to the writings of the mystics and the apocryphal gospels for more information about the last hours of Jesus. From these sources came the meeting of Jesus and his Mother, the story of Veronica, and the various falls of Jesus, which became part of the Stations of the Cross. One of the most popular of these "pilgrimages at home" was to pray the stations of the cross, which were erected in imitation of the stations (or stopping places of prayer) on the street in Jerusalem that led from the judgment hall of Pilate to Calvary. By the end of the sixteenth century the present fourteen stations became the standard for this devotion. Only recently has a fifteenth station been added: "The Resurrection." The Stabat Mater often accompanies the way of the cross. The fifteenth station is not visited during the season of Lent.

Please join us in meditation as we follow Christ's journey from Gabbatha (the stone pavement) where Jesus was condemned, to Golgotha (skull hill) where He was crucified, and onward to His resurrection.

Opening Devotions

Officiant We will glory in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ:

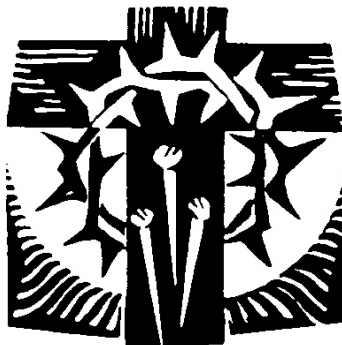
People ***In whom is our salvation, our life and resurrection.***

Officiant Together, let us pray. *(Silence)*

Assist us mercifully with your help, O Lord God of our salvation, that we may enter with joy upon the contemplation of those mighty acts, whereby you have given us life and immortality; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

The procession goes to the First Station as we sing "Stabat Mater."

***At the cross her vigil keeping,
Stood the mournful mother weeping,
Where he hung, the dying Lord:***



First Station - Jesus is condemned to death

Officiant We adore you, O Christ, and we bless you:

People ***Because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world.***

Officiant As soon as it was morning, the chief priests, with the elders and scribes, and the whole council, held a consultation; and they bound Jesus and led him away and delivered him to Pilate. And they all condemned him and said, "He deserves to die." When Pilate heard these words, he brought Jesus out and sat down on the judgment seat at a place called the Pavement, but in the Hebrew, Gabbatha. Then he handed Jesus over to them to be crucified.

V. God did not spare his own Son:

R. But delivered him up for us all.

Officiant Together, let us pray. *(Silence)*

Almighty God, whose most dear Son went not up to joy but first he suffered pain, and entered not into glory before he was crucified: Mercifully grant that we, walking in the way of the cross, may find it none other than the way of life and peace; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord. Amen.

Officiant and People
***Holy God,
Holy and Mighty,

"Stabat Mater" verse 2

***May we feel no bitter hatred,
When we too are persecuted,
Left alone to walk with you.***



Second Station - Jesus takes up his Cross

Officiant We adore you, O Christ, and we bless you:

People ***Because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world.***

Officiant Jesus went out, bearing his own cross, to the place called the place of a skull, which is called in Hebrew, Golgotha. Although he was a Son, he learned obedience through what he suffered. Like a lamb he was led to the slaughter; and like a sheep that before its shearers is mute, so he opened not his mouth. Worthy is the Lamb who was slain, to receive power and riches and wisdom and strength and honor and glory and blessing.

V. The Lord has laid on him the iniquity of us all:

R. For the transgression of my people was he stricken.

Officiant Together, let us pray. (*Silence*)

Almighty God, whose beloved Son willingly endured the agony and shame of the cross for our redemption: Give us courage to take up our cross and follow him; who lives and reigns for ever and ever. Amen.

***Now the Cross as Jesus bore it,
Has become for us who share it,
The jeweled Cross of Victory.***



Third Station - Jesus falls the first time

Officiant We adore you, O Christ, and we bless you:

People ***Because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world.***

Officiant Christ Jesus, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped; but emptied himself, taking the form of a servant, and was born in human likeness. And being found in human form he humbled himself and became obedient unto death, even death on a cross. Therefore God has highly exalted him, and bestowed on him the name which is above every name. Come, let us bow down, and bend the knee, and kneel before the Lord our Maker, for he is the Lord our God.

V. Surely he has borne our griefs:

R. And carried our sorrows.

Officiant Together, let us pray. (*Silence*)

O God, you know us to be set in the midst of so many and great dangers, that by reason of the frailty of our nature we cannot always stand upright: Grant us such strength and protection as may support us in all dangers, and carry us through all temptations; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

"Stabat Mater" verse 4

***Weakened, prodded, cursed, and fallen,
His whole Body bruised and swollen,
Jesus tripped and lay in pain.***



Fourth Station - Jesus meets his afflicted mother

Officiant We adore you, O Christ, and we bless you:

People ***Because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world.***

Officiant To what can I liken you, to what can I compare you, O daughter of Jerusalem? What likeness can I use to comfort you, O virgin daughter of Zion? For vast as the sea is your ruin. Blessed are those who mourn, for they shall be comforted. The Lord will be your everlasting light, and your days of mourning shall be ended.

V. A sword will pierce your own soul also:

R. And fill your heart with bitter pain.

Officiant Together, let us pray. (*Silence*)

O God, who willed that in the passion of your Son a sword of grief should pierce the soul of the Blessed Virgin Mary his mother: Mercifully grant that your Church, having shared with her in his passion, may be made worthy to share in the joys of his resurrection; who lives and reigns for ever and ever. Amen.

"Stabat Mater" verse 5

***Jesus met his grieving Mother,
She who made the Lord our brother;
Now the sword her heart has pierced.***



Fifth Station - The Cross is laid on Simon of Cyrene

Officiant We adore you, O Christ, and we bless you:

People ***Because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world.***

Officiant As they led Jesus away, they came upon a man of Cyrene, Simon by name, who was coming in from the country, and laid on him the cross to carry it behind Jesus. "If anyone would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me; for my yoke is easy, and my burden is light."

V. Whoever does not bear his own cross and come after me:

R. *Cannot be my disciple.*

Officiant Together, let us pray. (*Silence*)

Heavenly Father, whose blessed Son came not to be served but to serve: Bless all who, following in his steps, give themselves to the service of others; that with wisdom, patience, and courage, they may minister in his Name to the suffering, the friendless, and the needy; for the love of him who laid down his life for us, your Son our Savior Jesus Christ. Amen.

"Stabat Mater" verse 6

***Simon stopped in hesitation, Not
foreseeing his proud station, Called
to bear the Cross of Christ.***



Sixth Station - A woman wipes the face of Jesus

Officiant We adore you, O Christ, and we bless you:

People ***Because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world.***

Officiant We have seen him without beauty or majesty, with no looks to attract our eyes. He was despised and rejected by men; a man of sorrows, and acquainted with grief; and as one from whom men hide their faces, he was despised, and we esteemed him not. His appearance was so marred, beyond human semblance, and his form beyond that of the children of men. But he was wounded for our transgressions, he was bruised for our iniquities; upon him was the chastisement that made us whole, and with his stripes we are healed.

V. Restore us, O Lord God of hosts:

R. Show the light of your countenance, and we shall be saved.

Officiant Together, let us pray. (*Silence*)

O God, who before the passion of your only-begotten Son revealed his glory upon the holy mountain: Grant to us that we, beholding by faith the light of his countenance, may be strengthened to bear our cross, and be changed into his likeness from glory to glory; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Officiant and People

***Holy God,
Holy and Mighty,

"Stabat Mater" verse 7

***Brave but trembling came the woman,
None but she would flaunt the Roman,
Moved by love beyond her fear.***



Seventh Station - Jesus falls a second time

Officiant We adore you, O Christ, and we bless you:

People ***Because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world.***

Officiant Surely he has borne our griefs and carried our sorrows. All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned every one to his own way; and the Lord has laid on him the iniquity of us all. He was oppressed, and he was afflicted, yet he opened not his mouth. For the transgression of my people was he stricken.

V. But as for me, I am a worm and no man:

R. Scorned by all and despised by the people.

Officiant Together, let us pray. (*Silence*)

Almighty and everliving God, in your tender love for the human race you sent your Son our Savior Jesus Christ to take upon him our nature, and to suffer death upon the cross, giving us the example of his great humility: Mercifully grant that we may walk in the way of his suffering, and also share in his resurrection; who lives and reigns for ever and ever. Amen.

Officiant and People

***Holy God,
Holy and Mighty,
Holy Immortal One,
Have mercy upon us.***

"Stabat Mater" verse 8

***Prostrate on the dust he crumbled,
Flogged in body he resembled,
All our neighbors poor and scorned.***



Eighth Station - Jesus meets the women of Jerusalem

Officiant We adore you, O Christ, and we bless you:

People ***Because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world.***

Officiant There followed after Jesus a great multitude of the people, and among them were women who bewailed and lamented him. But Jesus turning to them said, "Daughters of Jerusalem, do not weep for me, but weep for yourselves and for your children."

V. Those who sowed with tears:

R. Will reap with songs of joy.

Officiant Together, let us pray. (*Silence*)

Teach your Church, O Lord, to mourn the sins of which it is guilty, and to repent and forsake them; that, by your pardoning grace, the results of our iniquities may not be visited upon our children and our children's children; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

"Stabat Mater" verse 9

***May our sympathy for Jesus
Turn to those who here now need us,
May we see Christ bruised in them.***



Ninth Station - Jesus falls a third time

Officiant We adore you, O Christ, and we bless you:

People ***Because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world.***

Officiant I am the man who has seen affliction under the rod of his wrath; he has driven and brought me into darkness without any light. He has besieged me and enveloped me with bitterness and tribulation; he has made me dwell in darkness like the dead of long ago. Though I call and cry for help, he shuts out my prayer. He has made my teeth grind on gravel, and made me cower in ashes. "Remember, O Lord, my affliction and bitterness, the wormwood and the gall!"

V. He was led like a lamb to the slaughter:

R. And like a sheep that before its shearers is mute, so he opened not his mouth.

Officiant Together, let us pray. (*Silence*)

O God, by the passion of your blessed Son you made an instrument of shameful death to be for us the means of life: Grant us so to glory in the cross of Christ, that we may gladly suffer shame and loss for the sake of your Son our Savior Jesus Christ. Amen.

Officiant and People
***Holy God,
Holy and Mighty,

"Stabat Mater" verse 10

***Jesus fell again in weakness,
Stumbling as we do, to lead us,
Through our sorrow and our pain.***



Tenth Station - Jesus is stripped of his garments

Officiant We adore you, O Christ, and we bless you:

People ***Because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world.***

Officiant When they came to a place called Golgotha (which means the place of a skull), they offered him wine to drink, mingled with gall; but when he tasted it, he would not drink it. And they divided his garments among them by casting lots. This was to fulfill the scripture which says, "They divided my garments among them; they cast lots for my clothing."

V. They gave me gall to eat:

R. And when I was thirsty they gave me vinegar to drink.

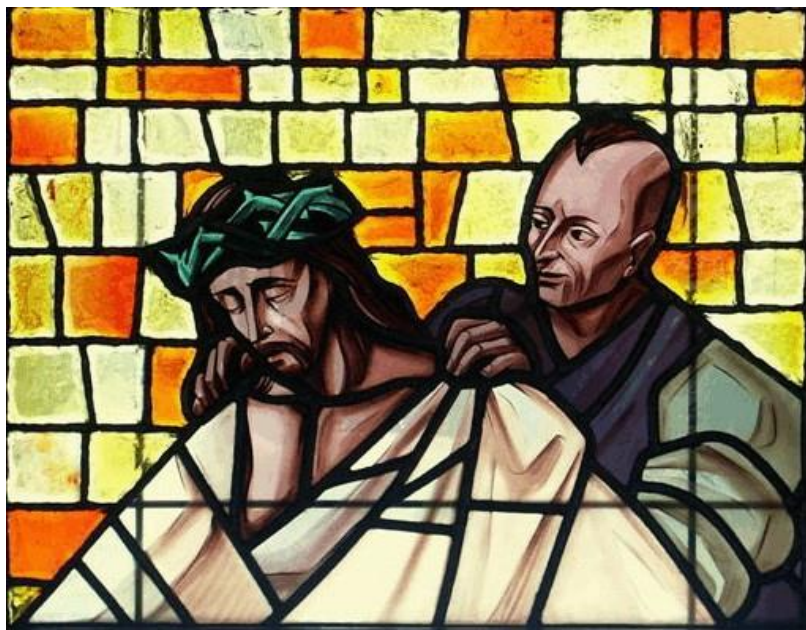
Officiant Together, let us pray. (*Silence*)

Lord God, whose blessed Son our Savior gave his body to be whipped and his face to be spit upon: Give us grace to accept joyfully the sufferings of the present time, confident of the glory that shall be revealed; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

"Stabat Mater" verse 11

***Stripped and jeered by his own nation,
Jesus stood in desolation,
Giving all He had to give.***



Eleventh Station - Jesus is nailed to the Cross

Officiant We adore you, O Christ, and we bless you:

People ***Because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world.***

Officiant When they came to the place which is called The Skull, there they crucified him; and with him they crucified two criminals, one on the right, the other on the left, and Jesus between them. And the scripture was fulfilled which says, "He was numbered with the transgressors."

V. They pierce my hands and my feet:

R. They stare and gloat over me.

Officiant Together, let us pray. (*Silence*)

Lord Jesus Christ, you stretched out your arms of love on the hard wood of the cross that everyone might come within the reach of your saving embrace: So clothe us in your Spirit that we, reaching forth our hands in love, may bring those who do not know you to the knowledge and love of you; for the honor of your Name. Amen.

Officiant and People

***Holy God,
Holy and Mighty,
Holy Immortal One,
Have mercy upon us.***

"Stabat Mater" verse 12

***Pierced the hands that blessed and cured us,
Pierced the feet that walked to free us,
Walked the hill of Calvary.***



Twelfth Station - Jesus dies on the Cross

Officiant We adore you, O Christ, and we bless you:

People ***Because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world.***

Officiant When Jesus saw his mother, and the disciple whom he loved standing near, he said to his mother, "Woman, behold your son!" Then he said to the disciple, "Behold your mother!" And when Jesus had received the vinegar, he said, "It is finished!" And then, crying with a loud voice, he said, "Father, into your hands I commend my spirit." And he bowed his head, and handed over his spirit.

V. Christ for us became obedient unto death:

R. *Even death on a cross.*

Officiant Together, let us pray. (*Silence*)

O God, who for our redemption gave your only-begotten Son to the death of the cross, and by his glorious resurrection delivered us from the power of our enemy: Grant us so to die daily to sin, that we may evermore live with him in the joy of his resurrection; who lives and reigns now and for ever. Amen.

Officiant and People

***Holy God,
Holy and Mighty,
Holy Immortal One,
Have mercy upon us.***

"Stabat Mater" verse 13

***Life eternal, death defiant, Bowed
his head the world was silent,
Through his death came life anew.***



Thirteenth Station - The body of Jesus is placed in the arms of his mother

Officiant We adore you, O Christ, and we bless you:
People ***Because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world.***

Officiant All you who pass by, behold and see if there is any sorrow like my sorrow. My eyes are spent with weeping; my soul is in tumult; my heart is poured out in grief because of the downfall of my people. "Do not call me Naomi (which means Pleasant), call me Mara (which means Bitter); for the Almighty has dealt very bitterly with me."

V. Her tears run down her cheeks:
R. And she has none to comfort her.

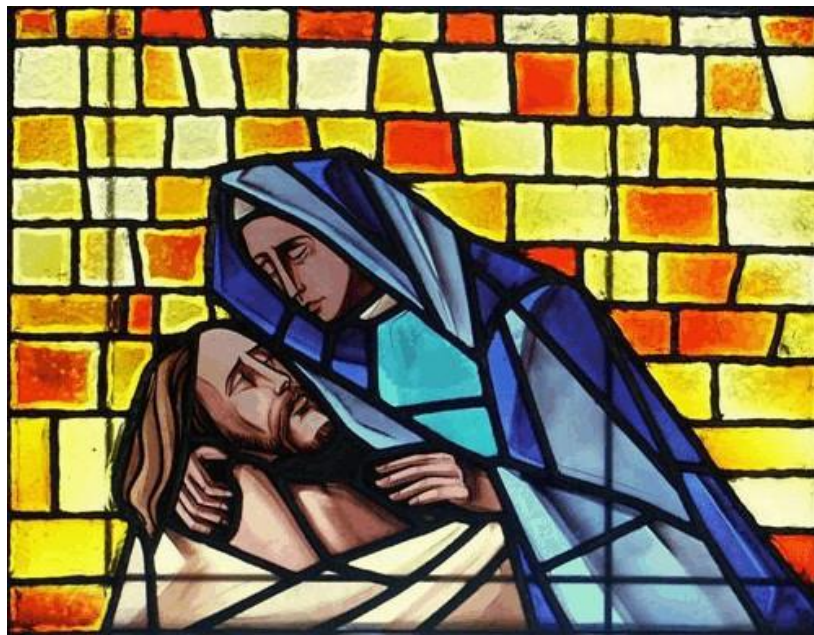
Officiant Together, let us pray. (*Silence*)

Lord Jesus Christ, by your death you took away the sting of death: Grant to us your servants so to follow in faith where you have led the way, that we may at length fall asleep peacefully in you and wake up in your likeness; for your tender mercies' sake. Amen.

Fourteenth Station - Jesus is laid in the tomb

Officiant We adore you, O Christ, and we bless you:

People ***Because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world.***

Officiant When it was evening, there came a rich man from Arimathea, named Joseph, who also was a disciple of Jesus. He went to Pilate and asked for the body of Jesus. Then Pilate ordered it to be given to him. And Joseph took the body, and wrapped it in a clean linen shroud, and laid it in his own new tomb, which he had hewn in the rock; and he rolled a great stone to the door of the tomb.

V. You will not abandon me to the grave:

R. Nor let your holy One see corruption.

Officiant Together, let us pray. (*Silence*)

O God, your blessed Son was laid in a tomb in a garden, and rested on the Sabbath day: Grant that we who have been buried with him in the waters of baptism may find our perfect rest in his eternal and glorious kingdom; where he lives and reigns for ever and ever. Amen.

did first what we should do.***



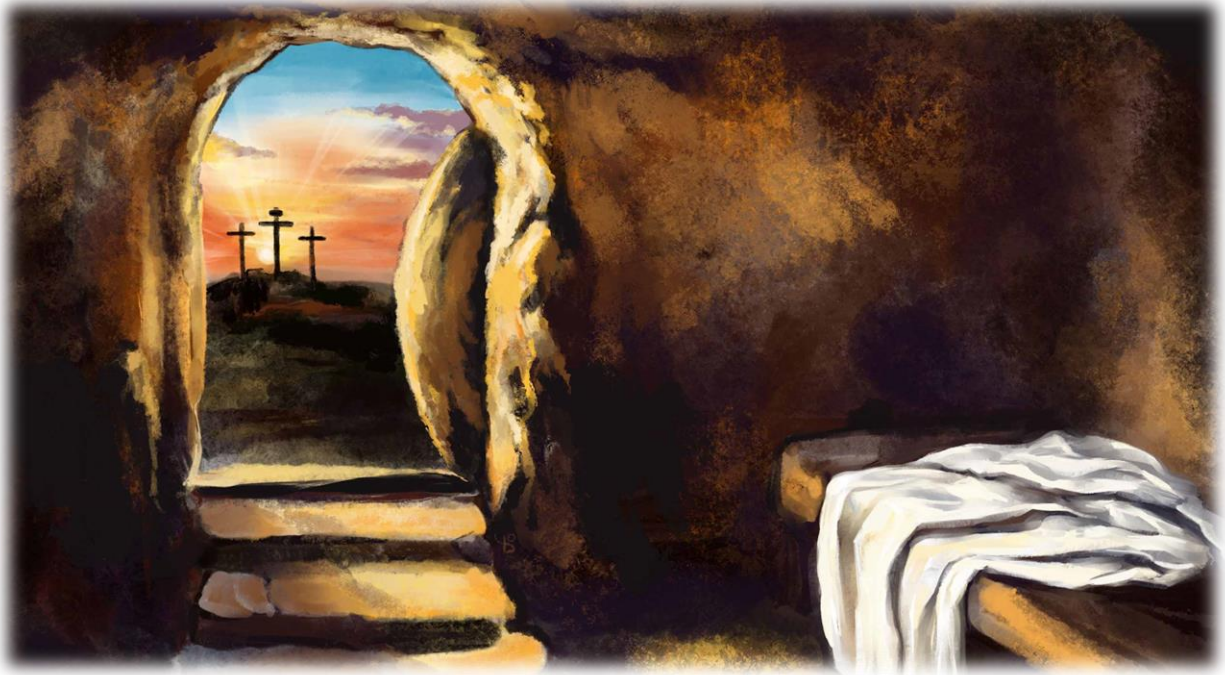
Concluding Prayers before the Altar

Officiant To Christ our Lord who loves us, and washed us in his own blood, and made us a kingdom of priests to serve his God and Father, to him be glory and dominion for ever and ever. ***Amen.***
