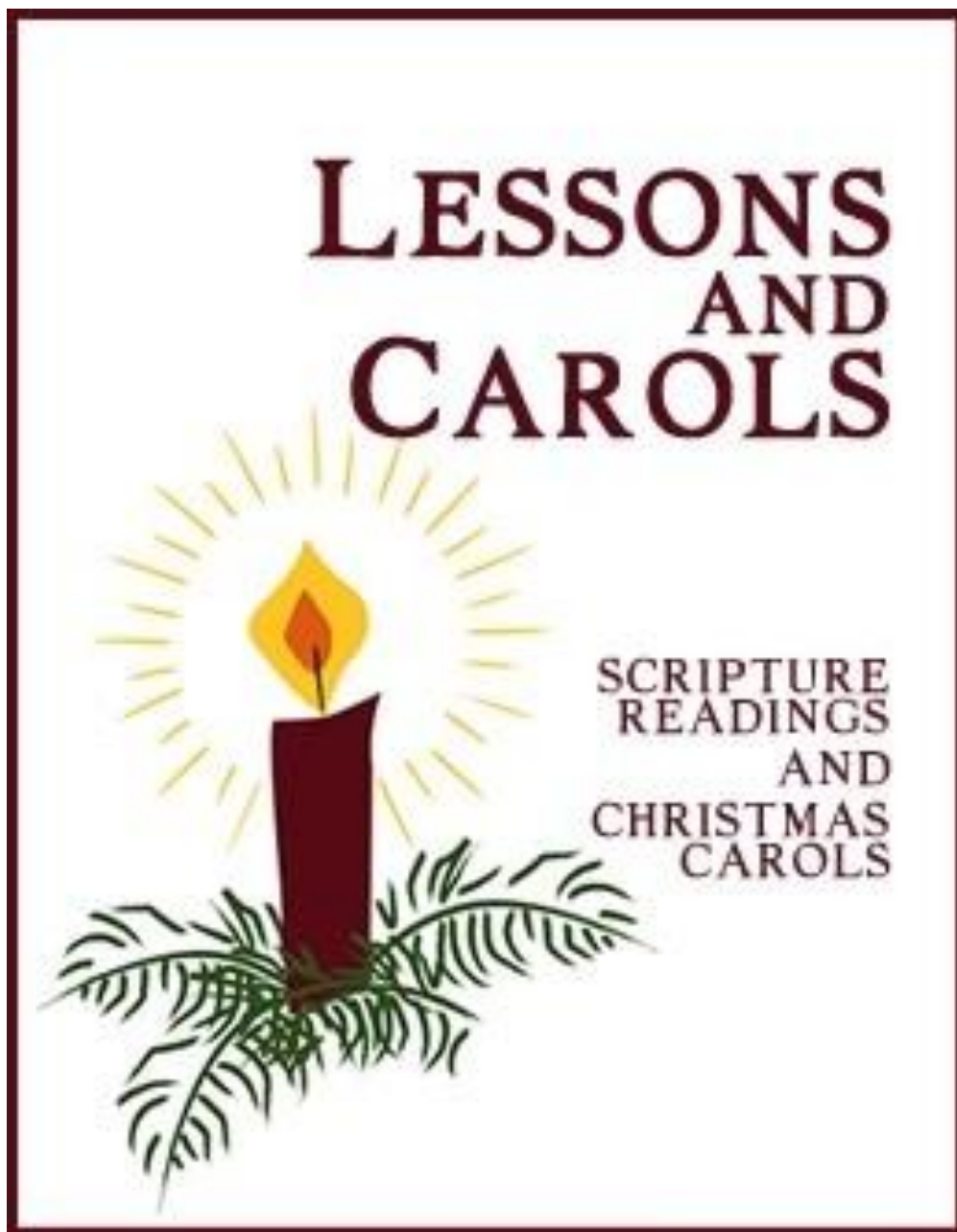

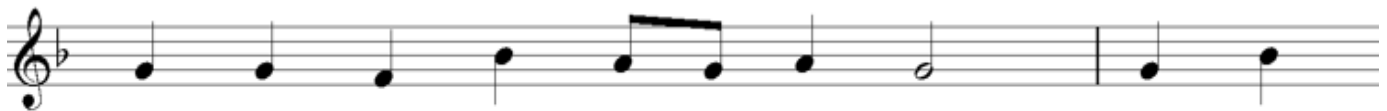

The people remain seated for the hymns and readings.

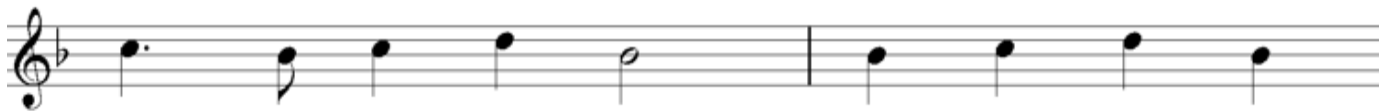

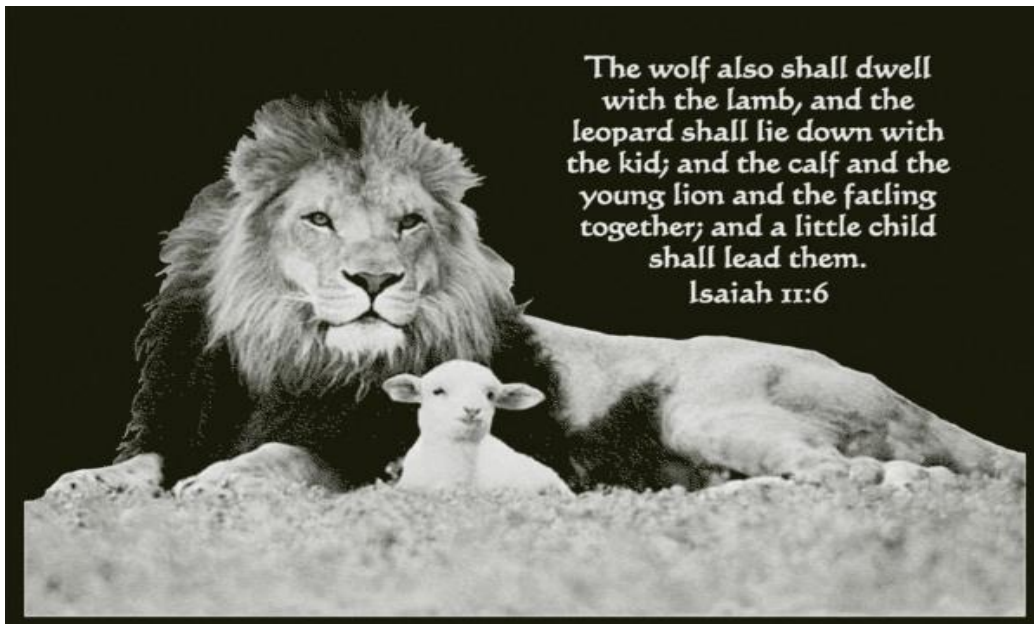

The Fifth Lesson—Matthew 2: 1-12

The wise men are led by the star to Jesus.
