



December 10, 2024 Commemoration of Thomas Merton, Contemplative

To the Clergy and People of the Diocese of Long Island:

As I write this letter, it is November 21, 2024. I am sitting in the very same chapel space within the guest house at St. Joseph's Abbey, in Spencer, Massachusetts, in which I discerned the call of the Diocese of Long Island to be a nominee for bishop in 2008.

Today, I write to share the news that I have informed the Presiding Bishop and Primate of The Episcopal Church, Bishop Sean Rowe, of my intention to resign as Bishop Diocesan of Long Island in September of 2026.

I am blessed to have served as bishop of this diocese for over fifteen years, and will have served seventeen years at the time of my retirement. This January 2025, I will turn 70.

And so, it is time for me to set into motion for the diocese, and especially the Standing Committee and eventual Joint Oversight Committee, the process of discernment for the search, nomination, election, and ordination of my successor, the Ninth Bishop of Long Island.

The Presiding Bishop's Office and the Office of the Bishop for Pastoral Development will provide consultants and much guidance for the almost 18-month process that will begin sometime early in the new year.

In the meantime, there is so much essential ministry to be accomplished together. I am encouraged by our most recent Diocesan Convention and the beginning of our process for mutual responsibility and interdependence within the deaneries of the diocese. Strengthening our witness and presence in the neighborhoods and communities we serve will remain my primary focus as the process unfolds.

I will remain actively and fully your bishop until the moment I hand the diocesan crozier into the hands of my successor during her or his ordination as bishop. Until that time, there is plenty of work to be done to build upon the strong foundations of Episcopal Health Services, The Mercer School of Theology, The Center for Spiritual Imagination, Camp DeWolfe, Episcopal Real Estate, Episcopal Ministries, the Trustees of the Estate, and the Cathedral of the Incarnation.

For now, I ask for your prayers for me, my family, and the staff of the diocese. I ask that, in every way you may be involved in the process that will unfold, that you remain focused on our witness as the church, the people of God. The process of calling our next bishop must be a holy work, a prayer-filled work, empowered by the Holy Spirit. It must be a sacred journey in which the people of God discern the future of our diocese and its ministry among the people we serve.

As always, each day, you will be in my prayers, and in my heart.



#### December 15, 2024 – Advent 3 (C) Third Week of Advent: Journeying with Community

As we continue our Advent walk, we invite you to see the Way of Love as a journey that includes the community. The witness of Zechariah and Elizabeth who bring infant John to the Temple to be circumcised reminds us of the importance of our faith community to sustaining the Way of Love. Just as the community did for John's family, communities provide a place for discernment, sometimes challenging us and other times affirming us. Communities celebrate and mark important moments along the journey.

#### Sunday, December 15 WORSHIP

Imagine the faces you'd like to see at church — an allstar list of folks you want to worship with. This could be people you know from summer camp when you were a kid, people who might have already died, people you work with — all your favorites. Commit to pray for those folks this week. And make a commitment to ask one of your all-stars to come to church with you in the next month.

#### Monday, December 16 PRAY

Pray along with the Collect for Advent 3, found on page 212 in The Book of Common Prayer. How will prayer guide you through the rest of the week? Set aside special time today to focus your intentions on stirring up peace and spreading joy.

#### Tuesday, December 17

Turn away from the busyness of the world right now. Turn your heart and mind toward giving thanks for this time of reflection, refreshment, and renewal.

#### Wednesday, December 18 BLESS

Spend a significant amount of time today discerning if there is a special blessing or gift you can share with your church, a local ministry, or with your community. Ask God to inspire and equip you with the fortitude and tools to make this gift something truly memorable and heartfelt.

#### Thursday, December 19 REST

Spend at least 45 minutes outside today, without doing yard work or fixing lights or redoing bows on the garland. Take some time to just sit outside and let the air wash over you, taking away the stress and worry of the moment.



Read Psalm 100 before and after your outside time. See how this psalm may help you rest and recharge your spirit.

#### Friday, December 20 GO

Read or watch your local news. Ask God to open your heart and eyes to ways you can promote reconciliation and healing in your community.

#### Saturday, December 21 LEARN

Read Matthew 4:18-22. How do these verses from Matthew inspire you to read Scripture with new eyes? Try reading several different translations of this passage. See how the language might change your reading of it.







#### Can I donate stocks to Saint Mark's?

When considering a gift or pledge for Saint Mark's, if you own stocks, you might want to look at donating highly appreciated stocks directly to the church's account. If you were to sell them first, you would have to pay capital gains on the appreciation but if you send the stock directly to the church without selling it, you get credit for the appreciated value of the stock without incurring a tax expense. The church will sell it immediately upon receipt and advise you of the value of your gift.




