The Finance Department is composed of two offices. The Office of the Treasurer manages the operating cash and the longer-term assets of the church, including the endowment portfolio and charitable trusts; oversees administration and management of the triennial budget; and administers the church’s socially responsible investments, including Economic Justice loans, refugee loans, and corporate proxy voting. The Office of the Controller records and processes all of the financial transactions for the church; assists the treasurer in developing and monitoring budgets; works with the church’s independent auditors to implement appropriate controls to safeguard assets and resources of the church; and leads the annual audit of financial statements in coordination with independent auditors.

ORGAN CONSTRUCTION: NEXT CHAPTER

Construction progresses, and you will note Columns are being covered with elegant cabinetry. You will also note if you peak into the church there is quite a collection of rather large PVC pipes.



These connect the blower, which is already in the attic, to many different bellows (a type of wind pressure regulator) that will supply air the windchests (box that the pipes sit on), and to each one of the 1,503 pipes. The PVC pipes will be run through the attic to reach the case being built on the left side of the chancel. They will also be run through the attic floor and through the wall to supply wind to the case that is yet to be built on the right side of the chancel. Many of the different sets of pipes imitate a type of musical instrument, ie. strings, flutes, trumpets, oboe, etc.



The box with the holes is the “Wind Chest” and each pipe will be placed into two holes, one above and one below and then connected with wires in the PVC to play a different note.

Hopefully, this will explain some of the massive number of parts that have been sitting all over the church since the zillions of organ bits arrived from Buffalo Cathedral.

All of this introduction, is to show the depth and diversity of volunteer jobs that we need to pull off this amazing project.

At the moment, construction and carpentry skills are what Stephen needs. Carpentry to build the “Wind Chests” and construction to lay the PVC up into the attic and connect to the blower. Later on, there will be jobs like twisting wire around copper tubes to make springs, and calibration the sizes of certain pipes, ie. Jobs that do not require brawn.

We will be publishing an update each week the most immediate needs. Currently we need carpentry and construction and can work with volunteer schedules. For example, if you know you can give two hours on such and such a date, let Stephen know and jobs can be scheduled accordingly.

Next week we need people who have worked with a table saw and can use the surface planning machine.

If you are intrigued or just a bit curious, bring your coffee around ten AM on Tuesdays or Wednesdays and visit just to understand what you might be comfortably able to do.

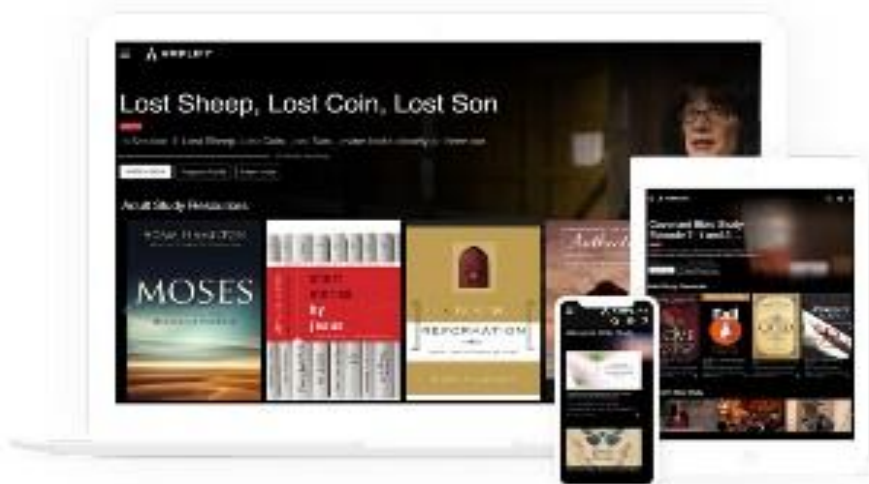
